


Digital Device Program



the digital device program



the problem

In March, COVID-19 forced Chicago Public Schools to make an unprecedented shift to virtual learning. This left over 115,000 students without access to e-learning because of the long-standing digital divide.

Chicago Public Schools worked to connect its students by implementing a short-term solution of loaning out 100,000 devices. This effort still left over 15,000 students without immediate access to elearning and 100,000+ students without long-term access to the digital world.





close to home

76.5% of Chicago Public School's 350,000 students are economically disadvantaged. Without support from the community, providing equitable access for every student will not be possible.




technology is a basic need

Although CPS loaned devices to students, many families were still under connected. Parents sharing devices with students or multi-student households were faced with the challenge of sharing vital resources to remain connected. Additionally, all devices distributed by CPS during the COVID-19 crisis must be returned. This leaves more than 100,000 students without long-term access to the basic need of technology.

what we're doing

We mobilized quickly and **gave**, not loaned, Chromebooks to students across Chicago. We had a specific focus on the city's most vulnerable youth, with 85% of our devices given to youth in foster care.


